1. Complete the "2021 Spring Tree Order Form". Send order form along with deposit or payment in full to the District in which your property is located. **All orders under \$100 must be paid in full at time of ordering. Orders more than \$100 will require a 50% deposit. Orders will not be placed without receipt of a deposit.** Remaining balance is due before pick-up. Orders may be placed by mail, phone or email and can be paid by check or credit card. Visa, MasterCard and Discover are accepted.

- 5. We do not guarantee survival. Our liability ceases when seedlings are delivered to buyer or custom planter.
- 6. "It is unlawful for these trees, shrubs and other plants to be resold with the roots attached in accordance with the Insect Pest and Plant Disease Act. P.A. 189 of 1931, as amended."
- 7. Pick-up location will be at the Paris Park Fish Hatchery. **Orders are not shipped.** You will be notified by postcard regarding dates and times for pick-up. Dates will also be posted on our website. **Tentative pick-up dates: April 23 & 24.**
- 8. If you are unable to pick-up your order on the scheduled dates you must make other arrangements. **We will not be responsible for lost or stolen trees that are not picked up on the scheduled pick-up dates.**
- 9. Let us know if a tree planter is picking up your order. The order must be paid in full prior to pick-up.
- 10. The District reserves the right to reduce or cancel orders and refund payments due to reasons beyond our control.
- 11. **No refunds on spring orders cancelled after March 31st.** Canceled orders paid by credit card will be charged for credit card processing fees.

Conifers (S)pring / (F)all

Red Pine Pinus resinosa (S,F)

Height: 40-80 feet, Full sun to light shade, Sandy soils Native tree. Also called Norway Pine. Needles dark green in color, two to a bundle and 4 to 6 inches long. Medium to fast growing. Uses: Windbreaks, timber production & wildlife cover.

Quantity: 500 Size (6-12") \$24 \$33 \$125 \$55

Jack Pine Pinus banksiana (S,F)

Height: 20-50 feet, Full sun, Very sandy soils

Very fast growing. Jack Pine often grows where no other trees will. Needles are stout, flat 1"-1 1/2" long, dark green in bundles of two.

Uses: Windbreaks, timber production and wildlife cover.

Norway Spruce Picea abies (S,F)

Height: 50-70 feet, Moderate shade tolerance, Rich moist

The fastest growing and tallest non-native spruce. Mature trees have drooping branches. Uses: Windbreaks, timber production, wildlife cover and ornamental.

Quantity: 50 100 250 Size (6-12") \$24 \$33 \$55 \$75 \$125

Eastern Redcedar Juniperus virginiana (S)

Height: 40-50 feet, Prefers full sun, tolerates drought and

Native evergreen. Excellent choice for wildlife food and cover. The waxy, blue berries ripen in autumn and are favored by many birds. This species is not generally browsed by deer.

Quantity: Size (12-18")

Northern White Cedar Thuja occidentalis(S) Height: 40-50

Evergreen which grows in cold, poorly drained swamps with moving water. Shade tolerant. Uses: Hedges, windscreens.

Quantity: Size (12-18") \$34 White Pine Pinus strobus (S,F)

Height: 70-100 feet, Full sun to shade, Range of soils Michigan's state tree. Soft flexible needles, five in a bundle with a 4 to 8 inch cone slightly curved. Fast growing, shade tolerant. Uses: Windbreaks, timber production, erosion control, and wildlife cover.

White Spruce Picea glauca (S,F)

Height: 40-60 feet, Full sun, Sandy to moist soils Native tree. Needles have a whitish cast, giving this tree its common name. Slower growing. Retains lower branches. Frequently used for Christmas trees and pulpwood. Uses: Windbreaks, ornamental and wildlife cover.

Blue Spruce Picea pungens (S,F)

Height: 40-60 feet, Full sun, Sandy to moist soils The most tolerant spruce for dry sites. Slow growing, long-lived non-native tree. Cone shaped with beautiful silver-blue needles.

Uses: Ornamental, wildlife cover and Christmas trees.

Tamarack/ American Larch Larix laricina

Height: 40-70 feet, Full sun, Moist soils

Member of the pine family. Usually found in wetlands but actually is a very rapid grower on upland sites. Turns bright golden yellow in the fall before shedding its needles. Shadeintolerant. Used for its forest product values.

Quantity: Size (12-18")

Balsam Fir Abies balsamea (S)

Height: 45-60 feet, Prefers a cool moist soil; highly shade tolerant. Relatively deer-browse resistant.

Deciduous (Spring only)

White Oak Quercus alba (S)

Red Oak Quercus rubra (S) Height: 50-70 feet, Open to partial shade, Sandy to moist soils Fastest growing of our native hardwoods. The wood is reddish brown. Sharply toothed 7-11 lobed leaves, turning red in autumn.

Uses: Excellent for timber production and wildlife.

Quantity: \$30 Size (12-18")

Height: 50-70 feet, Open to partial shade, Sandy to moist soils Large majestic native tree with wide spreading branches, and leaves of bluegreen turning to many colors in fall. Slow to medium growth rate. Provides sweet acorns that are loved by wildlife. Uses: Timber production and wildlife.

Quantity: Size (12-18")

Black Walnut Juglans nigra (S) Height: 50-75 feet, Full sun, Moist soils Queen of American cabinet woods. An important food source for wildlife. Fruit matures in Autumn with nutmeat sweet and edible. Growth is moderate to slow.

Uses: Very valuable timber and wildlife tree.

Quantity: Size (12-18")

Sugar Maple Acer saccharum (S) Height: 50-70 feet, Shade tolerant, Most soil types

This beautiful large shade tree has dark green foliage turning yellow to orange to fiery red in fall. The sap is used to make maple syrup. Slow to medium growing. Uses: Shade tree, lumber, and wildlife.

<u>Quantity:</u> \$30 Size (12-18")

Red Maple Acer rubrum (S) Height: 40-60 feet, Full sun, Most soil types

This native tree is medium to fast growing. It has small red flowers in early spring and brilliant red fall color. Very drought tolerant.

Uses: Shade tree, wildlife, and ornamental.

Quaking Aspen Populus tremuloides (S) Height: 50-60 feet, Full sun, Shade intolerant, Will tolerate a range of soils Also known as trembling aspen, smalltooth aspen, or "popple." Medium to large, fast growing tree. Uses: timber production, excellent wildlife food and cover.

<u>25</u> \$32 Quantity: Size (12-18")

Black Cherry Prunus serotina (S)

Height: 60-80 feet, Becomes shade tolerant as it grows older, Prefers sandy to loamy, well-drained

Fruit valuable to wildlife; wood valuable timber resource.

Quantity: <u>25</u> \$28 Size (12-18")

Fragrant Sumac Rhus aromatica (S)

Height: 2-6 feet, Full sun to partial shade, well-drained

Relatively slow growing shrub. Leaves turning orange to red in autumn. Aromatic when crushed. Attracts birds and butterflies.

Quantity: <u>25</u> \$28 Size (12-18")

Wildlife Shrubs (S)pring / (F)all

Red-Osier Dogwood Cornus stolonifera (S,F) Height: 5-8 feet. Full sun to shade. Moist to well drained

This multi-stemmed, spreading shrub has dark green foliage turning purple in the fall. Small white flowers in June produce white berries in fall.

Quantity: 100 Size (12-18") \$30 \$40 \$56

Common Elderberry Sambucus canadensis (S) Height: 8-12 feet, Full to partial sun, Moist soils A stout, strong-growing shrub with white flowers (July), followed by purple-black fruit. Readily used by wildlife. Fruits may be used in jellies, wines and pies.

Quantity: <u>\$2</u>8 Size (12-18")



Height: 10-30 feet, will grow on a range of soils; prefers full sun to moderate shade. Exhibit many different growth habitats. Good wildlife source.

Quantity: Size (12-18")

American Hazelnut Corylus americana (S)

Height: 6-8 feet, Prefers full sunlight and grows best in moist to dry soils

Produces a nut in August-September which is a very good source of food for wildlife.

Quantity: Size (12-18")

Eastern Redbud Cercis canadensis (S)

Height: Up to 30 feet, Many soil types but prefers moist, welldrained loams

Small native tree found in the forest understory. Good choice for brightening up your spring landscape.

Quantity: Size (6-12") \$28

Ninebark Physocarpus opulifolius (S)

Height: 8 feet, Full sun to partial shade, Moist soils Native wetland edge species. Pinkish to off-white flowers give way to small nutlet containing seed heads by early autumn. Recommended for border and screens.

Quantity: \$24 Size (12-18")

Highbush Cranberry Viburnum trilobum (S)

Height: 10 feet, Moderately shade tolerant, Moist soils Seen along streams, in open or lightly shaded swamps and wet grounds. Produces clusters of white flowers and scarlet fruits, which birds eat in late winter. Excellent wildlife plant.

Quantity: Size(6-12")

Spicebush Lindera benzoin (S)

Height: 6-12 feet, can tolerate dry to wet soils and prefers to grow in part to full shade. An aromatic shrub common to swampy woodlands, forests and riparian areas.

Gray Dogwood Cornus racemosa (S,F)

Height: 6-8 feet, Sun to shade, Wet to well drained soils Multi-stemmed shrub with grayish-green foliage becoming reddish in autumn. Flowers in May-June producing red berries July through September.

Uses: Ornamental; sometimes used for hedges

Quantity: \$38 Size (12-18") \$48

<u>Silky Dogwood</u> Cornus amomum (S,F)

Height: 6-10 feet, Sun to shade, Moist to well drained soils Dense, multi-stemmed shrub. Blue colored berries in September. Grows on sandy loam and clay uplands and wetlands. Good for landscape plantings on wet sites.

Quantity: Size (6-12") \$32 \$42 \$60

Nannyberry Viburnum lentago (S,F)

Height: 15-20 feet, Sun or shade, Most soil types This shrub has white flower clusters in June followed by bluish-black berries ripening in the fall. Recommended for wildlife plantings.

Winterberry / Michigan Holly llex verticillata (S)

Height: 6-12 feet, Moderately shade tolerant, tolerant of 📣 high water tables

Produces showy red fruit in September-October persisting into mid-winter.

Quantity: **\$3**0 Size (6-12")

American Plum Prunus americana (S)

Height: 10-15 feet, Prefers full sun, Well-drained soils Heavy floral display appears in May to early June. Plums ripen in August and September. This native plum provides good cover and food for wildlife on dry sites.

American Mt. Ash Sorbus americana (S)

Height: 10-30 feet, Moderately shade tolerant, Tolerates highly acidic, purely organic soil

Attractive small tree. One of the most beautiful flowering trees of the northern forest. Bright red berries in the fall.

Quantity: <u>\$2</u>8 Size (6-12")

<u>Arrowwood</u> Viburnum dentatum (S)

Height: 8-10 feet, Prefers well-drained soils and can tolerate some shade

An upright growing shrub with fruit in late summer often found growing along woodland borders and road sides.

Each of the approximately 200 varieties of Michigan wildflowers has a full page color photograph to aid in identification, and descriptions containing: family, height, flower, leaf, bloom time, origin, habitat and range, along with authors notes on each specific variety.
